

Tomato ‘Minebel’

Solanum lycopersicum

- Very compact, outdoor tomato plant suitable for pots
- After mid-May, or earlier if overnight temperatures are regularly $\sim 10^{\circ}\text{C}$ or more, start ‘hardening off’ – this means leaving plants outside during the day for a couple of weeks and then bringing back indoors overnight
- Once hardened off, plant out into as large and deep a pot as you have available using peat free compost
- Keep regularly well-watered (irregular watering can cause fruits to burst or blossom end rot) and feed fortnightly with an organic tomato liquid feed (diluting as per instructions)
- You should be able to harvest from August to October




Tradescantia zebrina (AGM)

Also known as the Silver Inch plant – tender trailing evergreen perennial to 15cm, with deep bronze-green leaves with two longitudinal silvery bands above, purple beneath; rosy-purple appear sporadically throughout the year. Grown as a houseplant (can be grown outdoors in summer).



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 **Plant into a bigger pot in spring, or when roots appear through the bottom of the pot**



Keep somewhere light but not too bright. If possible give some bottom heat, e.g. place on a windowsill over a radiator

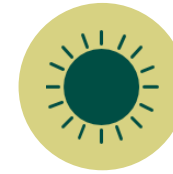


Keep moist but not too wet. If possible, place a clear plastic bag on top and remove every few days to provide ventilation

Helichrysum (Strawflower Mix)



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Keep at approx. 20-25 degrees Celsius and keep moist



Germination in 14-28 days



Prick out each seedling when two true leaves (i.e. two more than the first seed leaves that appear) and pot on into individual pots



Harden off when danger of frost has passed ~approx. mid-May



Plant somewhere well drained or in a pot. Plants reach 90cm tall and flowers can be dried in late summer
